BASIC TRAINING PACKING LIST

Sleeping bag

Foam sleeping pad (Yes the cabin has spring cot bunks, but you need to protect your sleeping bag from the metal springs. Bunks do not have mattresses.)

Mess kit (plate or bowl, fork, knife, spoon, cup)

Water Bottle

Pen, Pencil and Notepad (5x7 book)

Toothbrush, toothpaste, small towel

Hiking boots (Scouts with sneakers only will not be allowed to attend)

“Class A” BSA shirt

Activity shirts (t-shirt)

Long Sleeved Shirt

Rain Gear (poncho or rain suit)

1 pair long Scout pants

Extra underwear & socks

BSA Handbook (in ziplock bag)

Flashlight

Compass

Piece of rope (to practice knots)

Jacket appropriate for weather

Lip balm & Sunscreen

Personal First Aid kit

Day Pack (book bag style) for hiking

Warm hat

Warm set of sleeping clothes

Some optional items:

Cards

Book bag type backpack is in case we go for a hike

Remember, the key to staying warm is to stay dry. Cotton clothes (like jeans) retain water and don't dry out – try to avoid them. Dress in layers, so that you can add or remove layers as necessary during the day. Your outer shell should be both waterproof and windproof. Don't forget your feet and your head – wet feet mean cold feet and you lost much of your body heat through your head – cover it up. And the last thing – make sure you put on a dry set of clothes before you get in your sleeping bag, or you will be cold all night.

NO RADIOS, ELECTRONIC GAMES, CELL PHONES, ETC.

Remember to dress in your Class A uniform with your hiking boots on when we meet in the parking lot on Friday afternoon.

Have something for dinner before you arrive.

Friday we plan an evening snack only.

DO NOT BRING PERSONAL FOOD FROM HOME. IT ENDS UP IN THE TENT AND CREATES A PROBLEM WITH ANIMALS (the four legged variety).
